 - Cash award of \$10.00 to be given for best Educational program.
- **State Project:** The two tuberculosis sanitoriums located in Clinton and Talihina. Purchased therapy equipment for Clinton in the amount of \$1,000, and a Jefferson Ventilator, assembly trailer and table and chair for Talihina in the amount of \$1,000, for a total of \$2,000, plus kits for patients in the amount of \$1,126.66.
