donations is at the end of this issue and on our state website <http://www.oklaesa.org>. This is another perfect way to share ESA in our local communities. Let's do it!

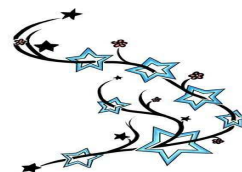
Have you submitted your OK State Convention registration? Grab your bag and join in the fun with our Oklahoma members.
